Interdependent Reality

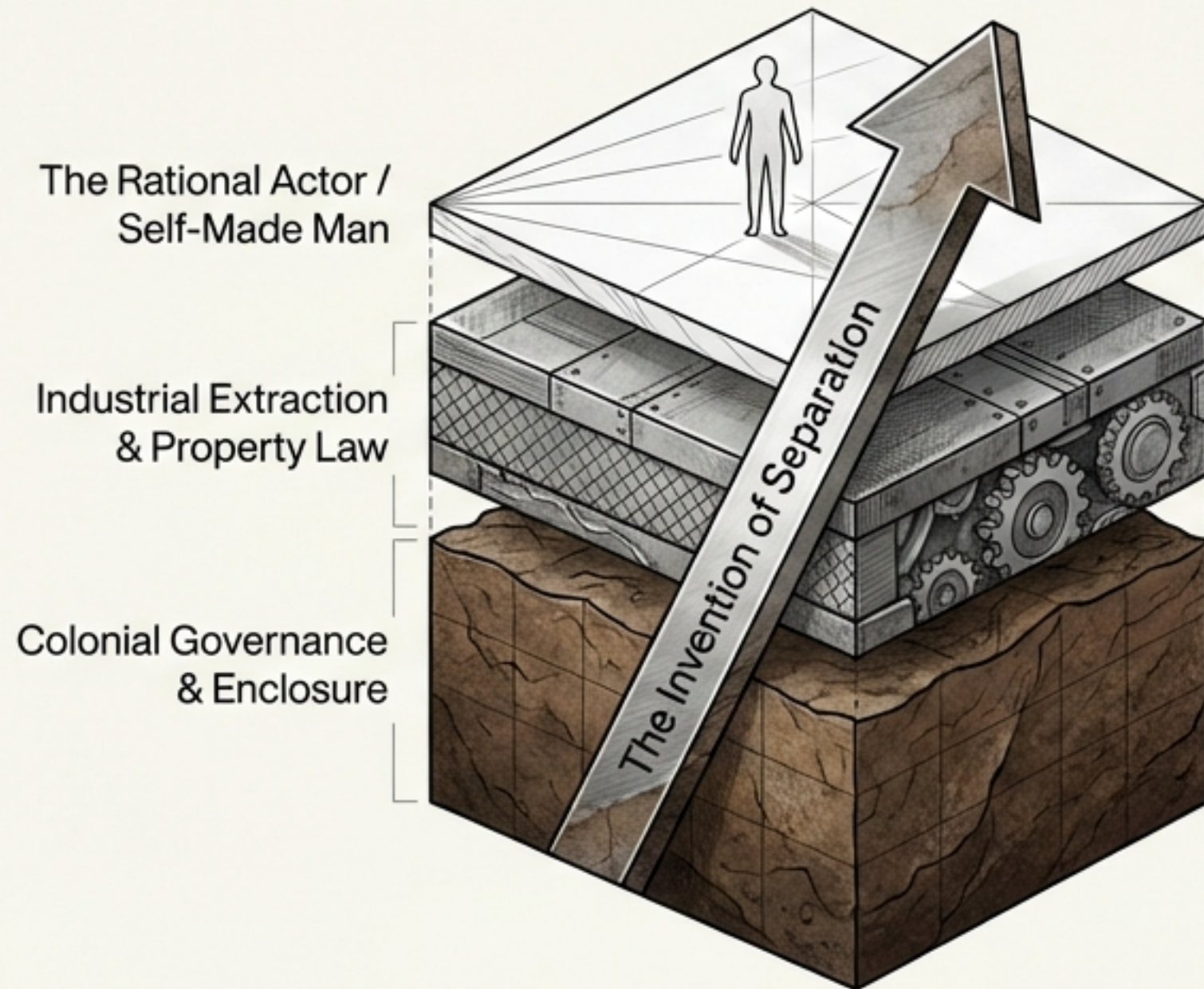
We are trying to solve relational problems with separatist tools.



Individualist Systems

Individualism is a technology, not a universal truth.



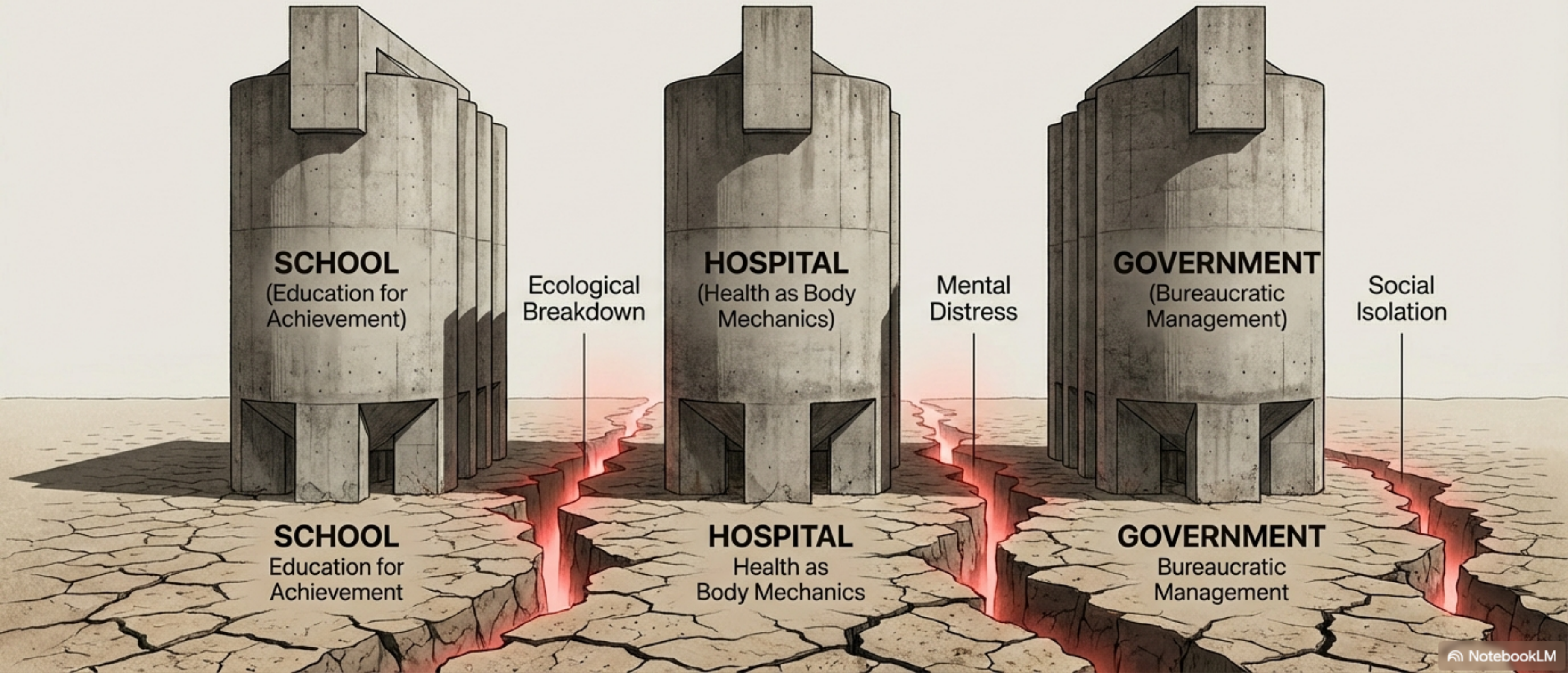
The Invention: Emerging alongside colonial expansion, the 'individual' was redefined by ownership of land, labor, and self.

The Function: Effective for organizing industrial growth and administrative control.

The Limit: A design for extraction, not for care.

Problems are emergent properties of the gaps between our institutions

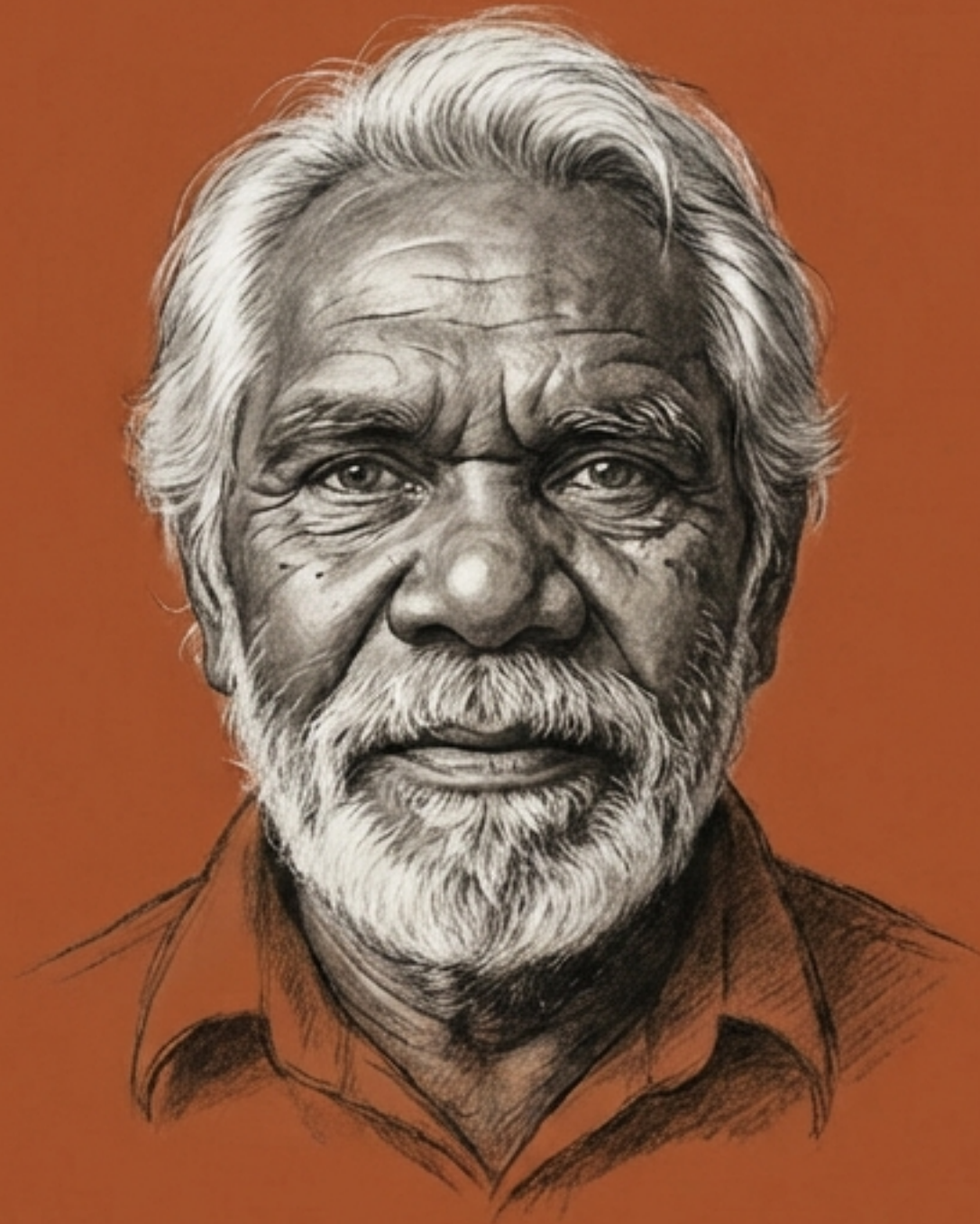


Belonging is an ontological condition, not a sentiment.

Lived Law, Not Metaphor.



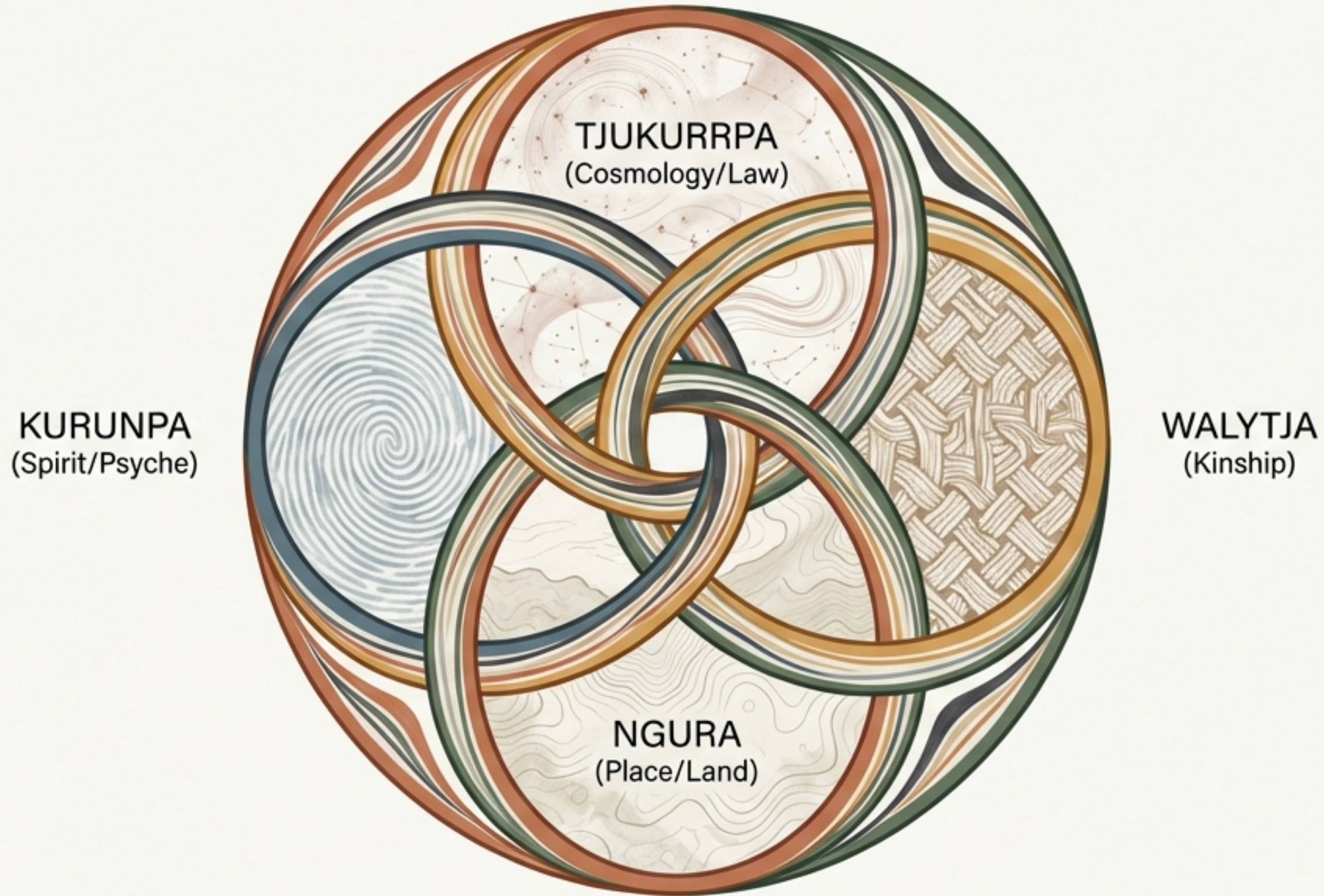
KANYINI

The Four-Fold Architecture of Coherence



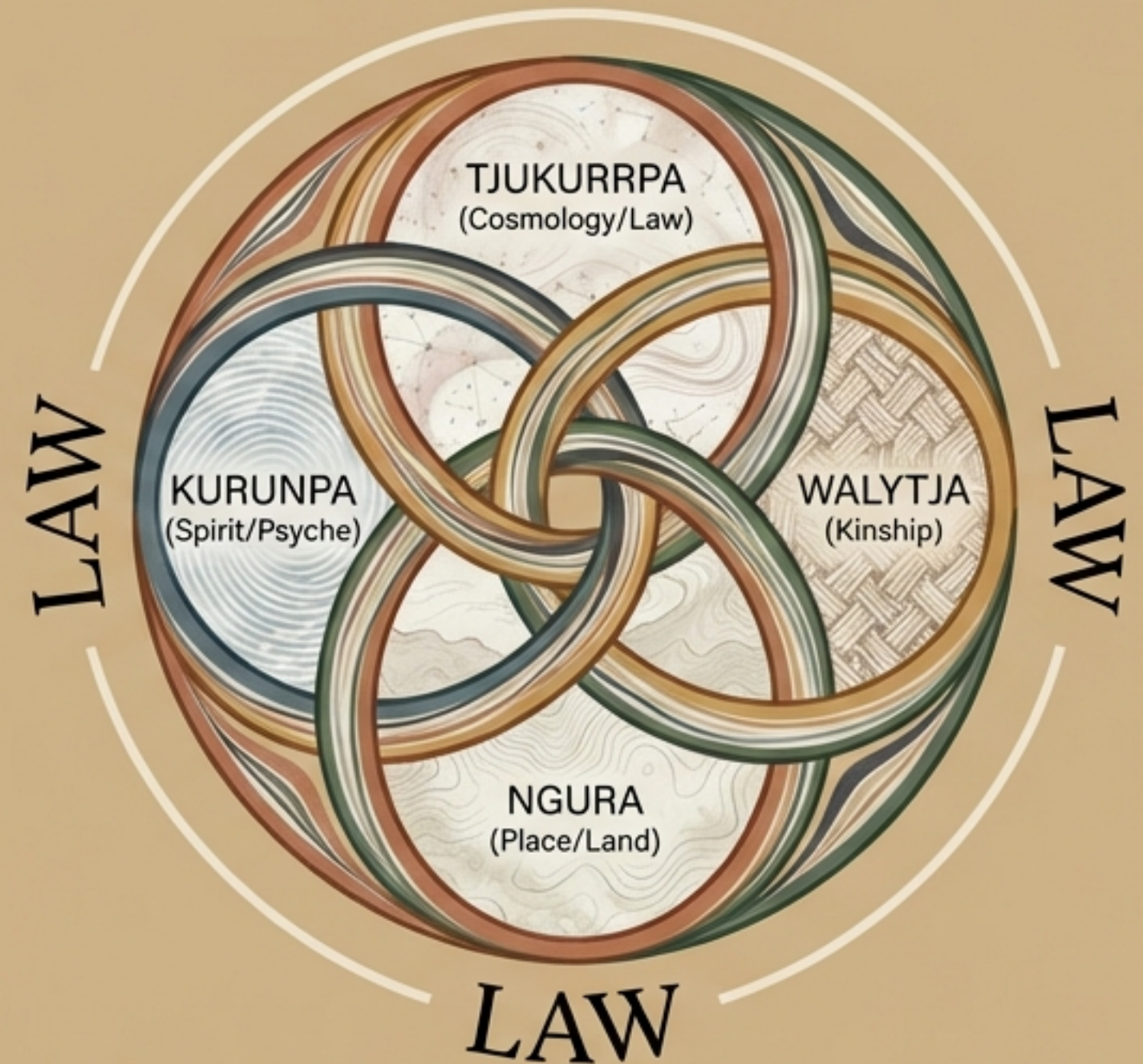
A system where Cosmology, Kinship, Place, and Spirit are mutually constitutive.

The Modern Silo

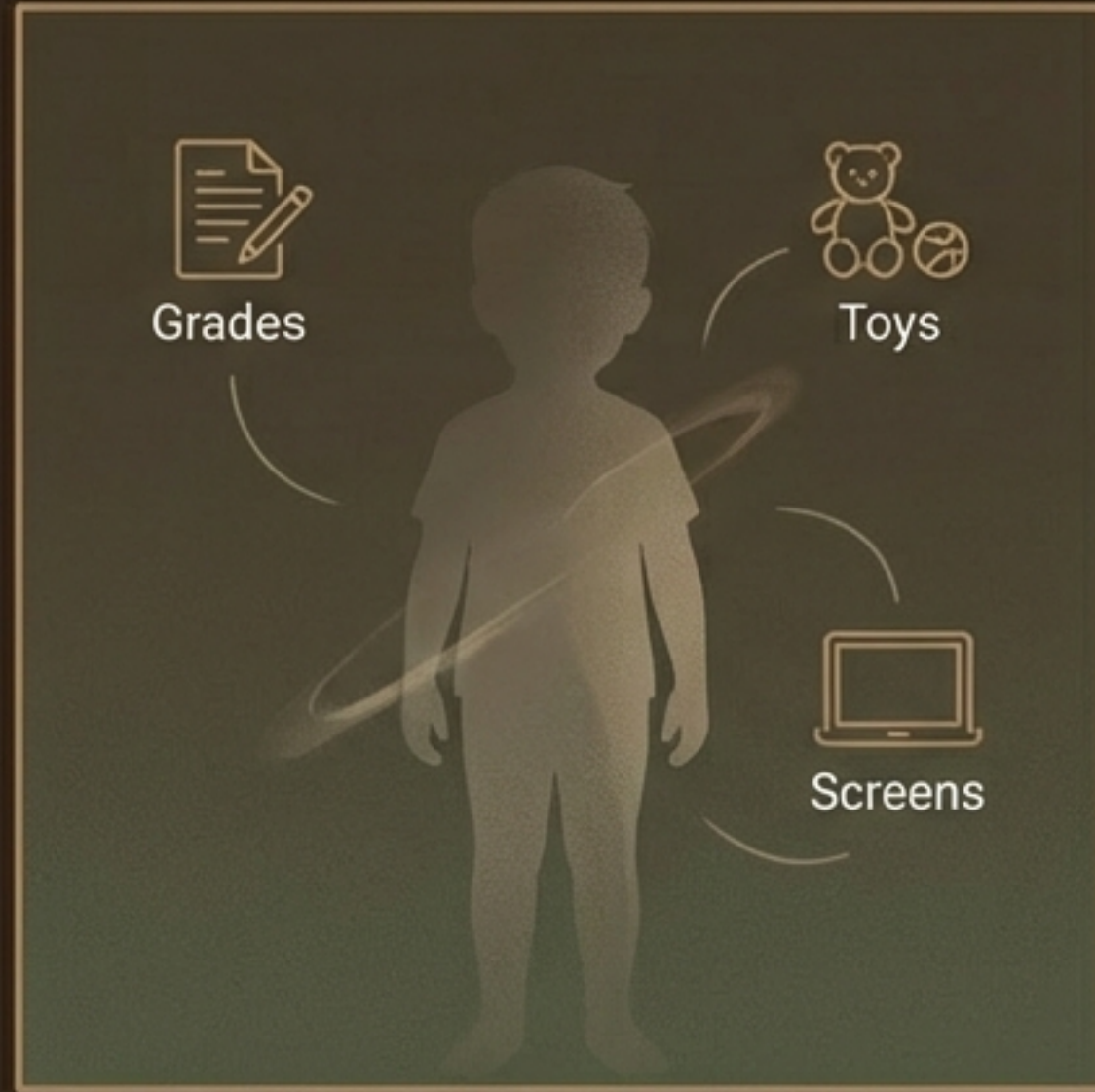


The Kanyini Web

(Interdependence)

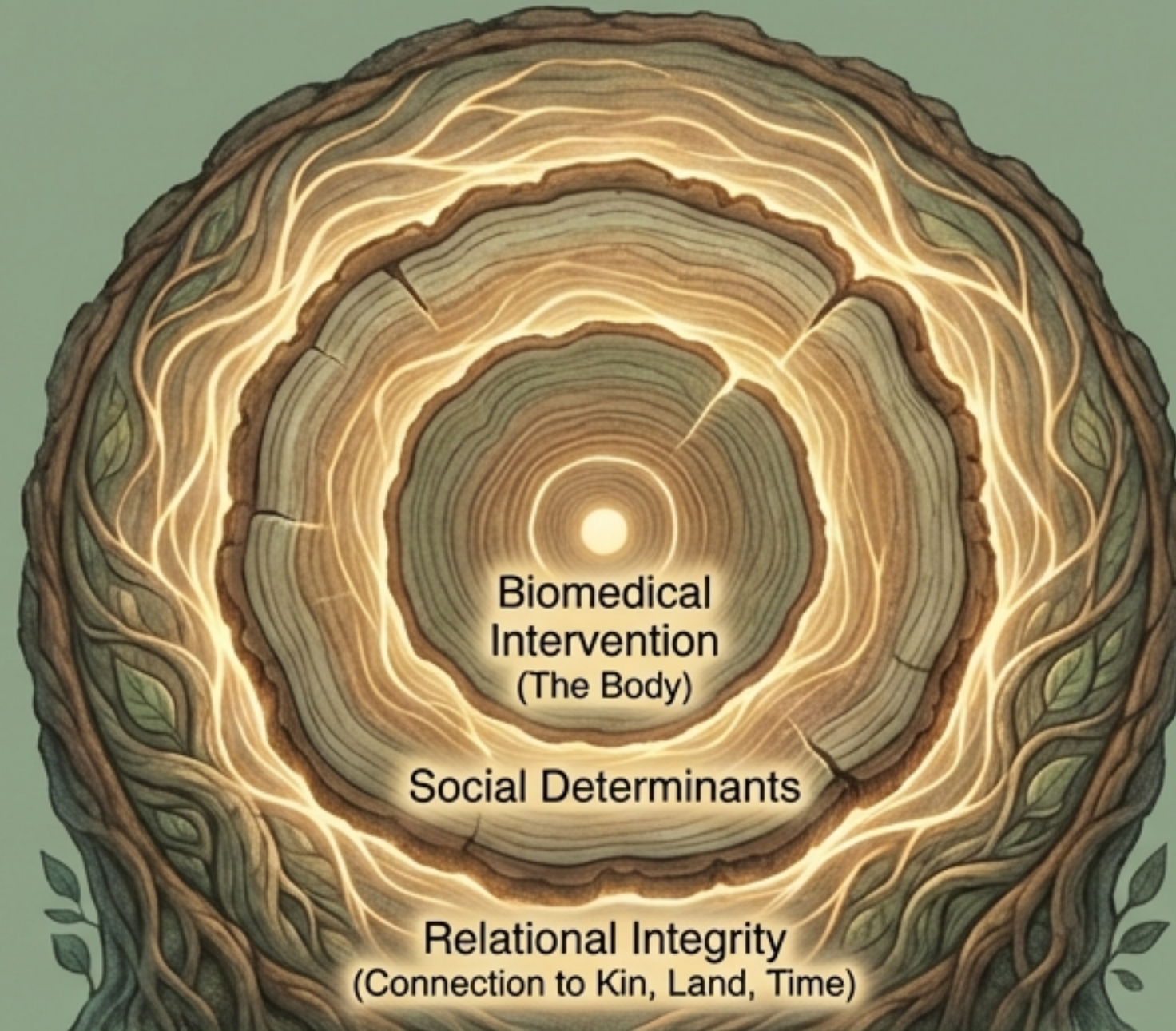
Systems Theory:
